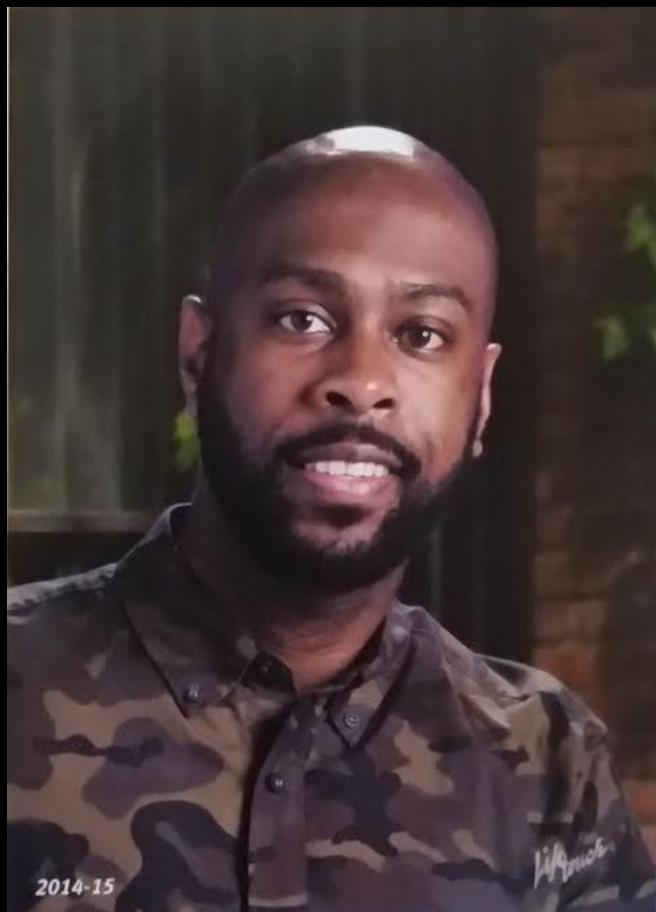

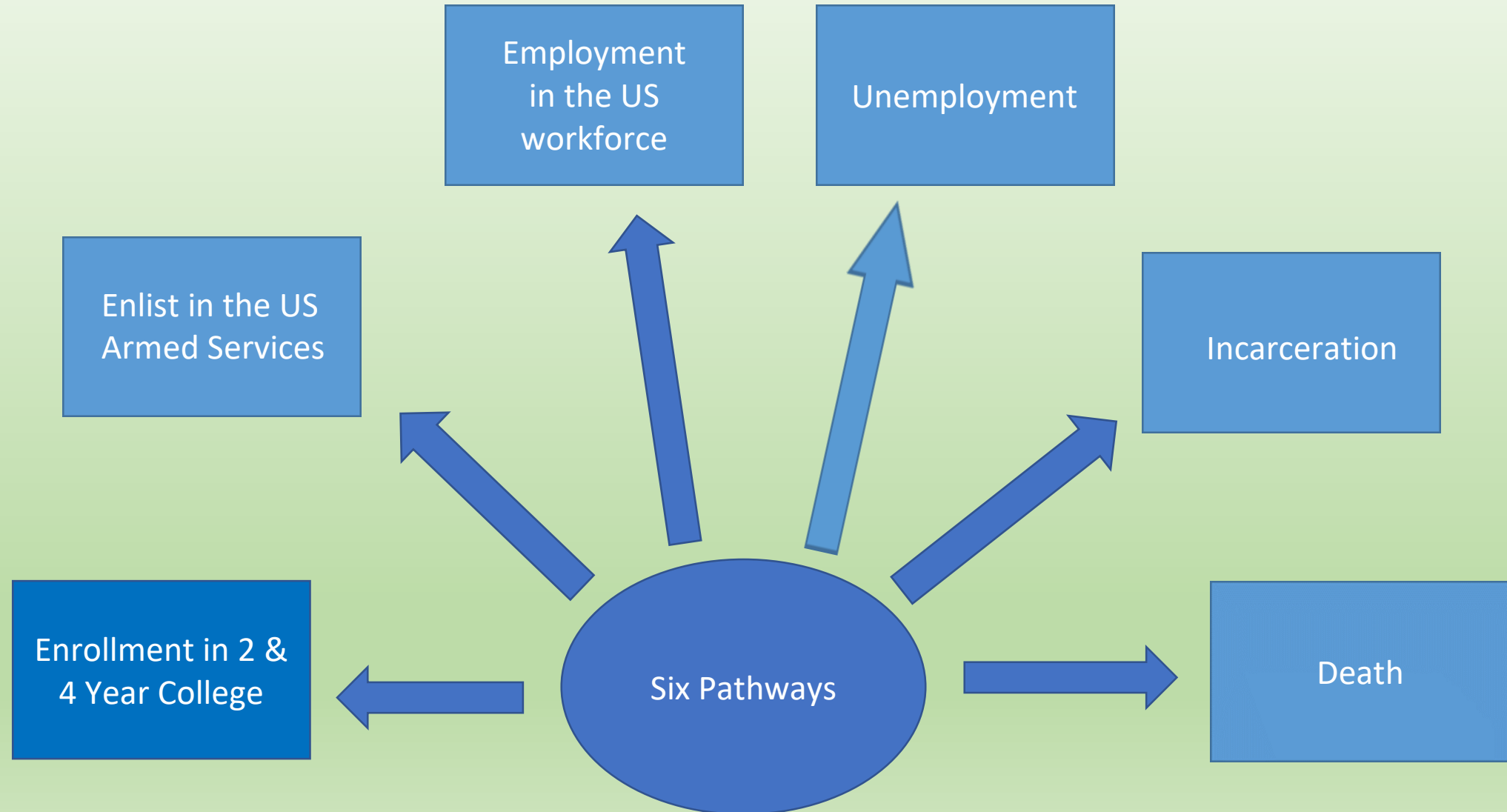

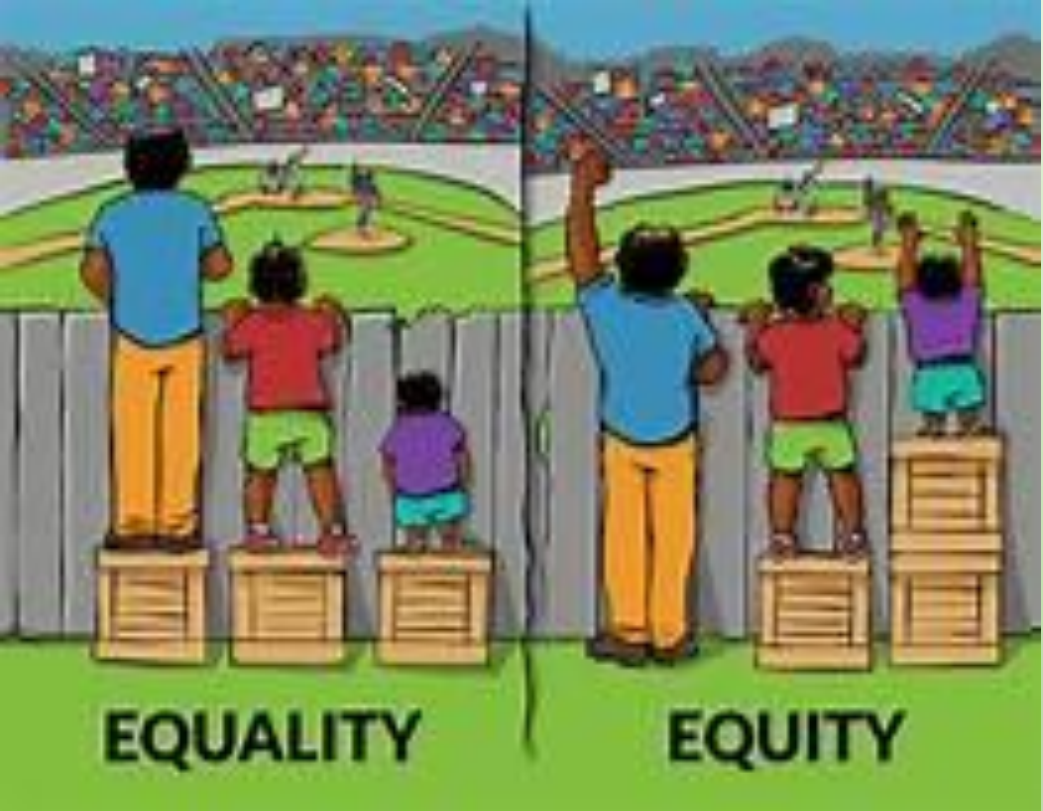


DHS Mission

Campus Entry Points

Main Entrance (Parents & Students)

10th Grade Entrance (Students Only - Buses)

9th Grade Entry (Students Only-Buses)(9th grade Parents)

Academy Entrance (Students Only)(Car Riders)

***All Visitors must enter through the Main entrance (Eagle Drive)**

Safety & Security

- All students & visitors will pass through metal detectors
- All visitors must have their ID
- All visitors must have an escort
- All bags & purses will be searched daily
- All contraband will be confiscated (Leaving bags at doors to sneak in items (Major Breach). Students are subject to disciplinary actions
- Exterior doors are checked multiple times per hour (Exterior door latches are checked weekly)
- Students are not allowed to open or prop-open exterior doors for any reason. (Violators are subject to disciplinary action as a major security breach)
- All classroom doors will be closed & locked during instruction.

***Please contact the main office for family emergencies**

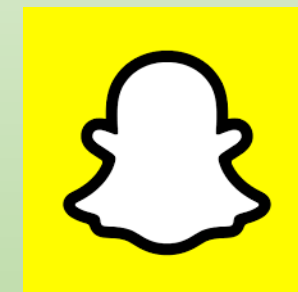
